Advice: Bogus officials/ distraction burglars

Your latest Smart Alert.

We are reminding people to be wary when answering the door to unexpected callers, following a number of recent distraction burglaries involving bogus Water Board officials across Staffordshire. The victims, aged between 86 and 101, were distracted by a man 'checking' the taps in the kitchen or bathroom, while a second man located and stole cash from the home. Descriptions are of two white men aged 30-40 years old. **DO NOT** let anyone into your home unless you know who they are or what they are there for.

NEVER TRUST anyone calling at the door without a prior appointment. Should you receive such a call, leave the door locked. The caller will hear you through the door when you ask them who they are. If they say they are from a utilities company, ask for your account number. They should have this if they are genuine. If not – do not let them in, tell them to leave and that you are calling the police. **ALWAYS ASK FOR ID**, and check

it. Even if someone claims to be an official – and that includes police officers and council representatives – people must have their ID checked.

DO NOT allow anyone to carry out work on your home or sell you anything when they cold call at the door. If you require work to be done **INSTIGATE IT YOURSELF**, by phoning three companies and asking for like for like quotes. Then decide. Residents should also follow the **STOP, CHAIN, CHECK** rule when people call at the door. **STOP** – If you are not expecting anybody and they don't have an appointment, don't let them in. **CHAIN** - Use your door chain or bar before opening the door **CHECK** – Ask to see ID and double check this.

Keep your doors locked even when you are home.

Police Contact Advice: Telephone 999 in an emergency where there is a danger to life or a crime is in progress.

Telephone 101 for non-emergencies where police attendance is required, to report a crime or to report any other incidents. Calls to 101 have a fixed cost of 15p per call.

Cold comfort?

Over the last couple of winter editions we have mentioned the challenges the road surfaces pose during the cold months and the need for good observation of the conditions ahead. This time we are looking at equipment and clothing. Good observation is critical as we know and having a clear visor or screen (in a car) is vital to enable us to have a chance of good observation skills. Misting of the visor can be very problematic on cold days, particularly when we have to stop, say at traffic lights. There are various anti-mist solutions on the market which can help or you can just ride with the visor slightly open to keep an airflow passing the visor surface. If you keep your bike outside overnight then also make sure the screen (if your bike has one) is clear of frost. This is also very important for car drivers. Spending a few minutes defrosting the screen is vital and please don't set your car engine running and pop back into the house for a quick tea/coffee. Cars have been stolen in such circumstances!

Motorcyclists have additional issues in keeping warm! In recent years there has been some excellent electrically heated kit developed such as heated handlebars and even gloves and waistcoats. These do a great job of maintain the rider's comfort in the cold but don't entirely depend on it. These devices, like lots of other things, break down occasionally and loss of body heat can be seriously dangerous. The effects of hypothermia are well

documented and can be an issue but loss of concentration can occur long before this medical condition becomes significant. Just think back to the last time you were really cold and try to remember how much attention you paid to the task you were doing. Thoughts of how to get warm are far higher in your consciousness and the consequent lack of attention to the road and your riding results in a very risky situation. If you are going to rely on just warm clothing, which is quite satisfactory, then follow a few simple rules. Firstly, try and have a few layers under your outer waterproof jacket and trousers. This might mean having slightly larger items such as boots and gloves to allow for the extra pair of gloves and socks. A waterproof outer layer is essential, particularly if you are travelling any distance. Rainwater which seeps through into your clothing will quickly chill you. Remember that apart from the low temperature, when riding a bike you are also subjecting yourself to the equivalent of a 40 or 50 mile an hour wind chill! The last bit of advice mainly concerns those who travel longer distances. If even after all this protection you still feel cold on a journey then stop somewhere and go in to a cafe for a hot drink. That break and recovery time will ensure your attention remains high and hence raises your safety factor. Have a great winter and we'll soon be thinking of the warmer weather returning in spring!
Ride and drive safe!

Organic Gardening, the best thing since sliced bread or is it: ALL MUCK AND MYSTERY.



I was trained as a gardener during the 1960s when chemicals were king and the answer to every problem on the globe! As a species the human race has evolved to realise that this is not

quite the case but as is usual the pendulum has swung in another direction towards an approach which abhors the use of any techniques which use chemicals of any sort. The intent of this short article is to demystify both approaches in a way that takes the best from both scientific and organic approaches to gardening in a way that the amateur can sensibly use.

Composts For Growing Plants

Before World War 2 most growers and head gardeners in private estates had their own potting composts for everything. This produced so much yield variety that the John Innes Institute carried out a research programme to nationally accepted standard pot plant of excellent quality that both the nursery trade, and amateurs could accept in respect for both seed and a range of potting composts. This completely replaced the “ad hoc” arrangements and quality issues of the older composts except for specialist areas. The problem with it related to the loam. The original compost was designed around a medium loam sourced from the Kettering area and substitute loams were not as good. In addition the loam had to be sterilised and this itself gave rise to “ammonia scorch” in some loams. As a consequence peat based composts were introduced, these are lighter, have good water holding qualities and are in standard use today, in my mind quite acceptable given that the rarer peats are avoided for conservation reasons. Some

new additives such as recycled material have recently appeared and coir is also added to some composts. These can give rise to management problems so my advice is choose your compost carefully - match it with the crops you grow, remember that you will normally have to supplement the plant nutrients in a peat base general compost regularly after 6 weeks and you can use modern compost with confidence.

Composts Used For Border Enrichment.

Here I believe the organic approach complements (but cannot replace) the use of artificial fertilizers. This is because the incorporation of organic matter, if sensibly chosen can improve soil structure in a number of ways. The issue (as always) is what to choose, why the material is chosen, what the benefit will be, and how best to apply it. The materials below are but a fraction of what is available but the general principles apply to most. These are:

- a. Whether the material is to be dug in or applied to the soil surface.
- b. The age of the compost.
- c. Source of supply.
- d. Cost.
- e. Possible risks to crop or soil health.

Farmyard Manure.

This is normally cow, horse, or pig sourced. These are fine manures and all have to be well rotted for maximum benefit. I would choose pig manure last of all because pigs kept indoors are usually bedded on wood shavings and best incorporated into garden compost before use.

Poultry Manure.

MUST BE well rotted before use or the crop may suffer ammonia scorch.

Garden Compost.

If well rotted, mixed, free from perennial

weeds or disease crop remains a compost which is entirely appropriate (and free).

Peat.

Should only be used where acid loving crops are grown. Care has to be taken when selecting the supply source because some moorland peats have a pH far too low for horticultural use.

Methods of incorporation.

These are entirely up to the gardener and the system of growing used. Except for my Sweet Pea crop I use surface mulch application to all my crops and a “no dig” approach to my gardening. Others may choose single or double digging (no one way is perfect) the main argument is to use BOTH the organic use of composts and the certainty of appropriate fertilisers to maximise display or yield.

Moorland Voices’ final concert was in conjunction with another choir based in Grahamstown, called Pro Carmine. They staged this concert at NELM (National English Literary Museum) to raise money for a charity, Joza Reading Club whose aim was to help raise literacy standards amongst poorer children of South Africa and to encourage a lifelong interest in books and reading. The standard of singing was superb and over 5000 S.A rand was raised to help disadvantaged children.

Moorland Voices, partly directed by Sarah Williams who lives on Ash Bank, are currently rehearsing for their Christmas concerts. This talented and versatile choir promises a traditional carol concert with a modern twist. Their “local” concert is on Sunday December 10th at the magnificent Pugin Church in Cheadle at 7.30. STAMPING OUT ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR!

Youths caught hurling eggs and apples BANNED from village for 48 hours. Traders have been advised not to sell large quantities of items to children as police step up patrols

Egg-chucking jobs face being banned from a village for 48 hours after police vowed to step patrols following a spike in anti-social behaviour. Fed-up families in Werrington have reported eggs and apples being thrown at homes and moving vehicles, while groups of youths have also been gathering and intimidating residents.' Source: The Sentinel You may well have seen this headline or even been caught in this episode of blatant anti-social behaviour.

It was becoming apparent through an increase in referrals to the Anti-Social Behaviour Hub in the Community Library that we were experiencing escalating problems from groups of kids hanging around and displaying intimidating behaviour which was especially disturbing to the more vulnerable older people living in the area. As a direct response, from the intelligence gained through the ASB Hub we worked closely with the PCSOs who led the initiative to put in place a Section 35 dispersal order, allowing the police to effectively target the problem and break up the groups. We work closely with the police who visited the local schools and have spoken with schoolchildren to highlight the fear felt by senior residents as a result of unacceptable behaviour.

The hub isn't there to tarnish children. We are looking to give out citizenship awards for those who do good things in the area. Anti-Social behaviour isn't just about children,

many adults act in ways that are absolutely unacceptable, not least when they host a party without considering their neighbours:

THOUGHTFULL PARTY ETIQUETTE

Tell Your Neighbours. Speak to your closest neighbours, especially those who live next door, and let them know the approximate time that your party is going to start and when it's likely to finish. You might also consider inviting them. This will foster good relations, and the effects of the party are far less likely to upset or annoy those living around you. Try and plan your party around your immediate neighbour's normal life behaviour. For example, if you know they always go out on a Friday night but tend to stay in on a Saturday, it makes sense to have the party on the Friday evening when they're probably not going to be there.

Likewise, if they work shifts or have children consider these and work around them.

Keep to The Accepted Rules. Music that is so loud that your neighbours can hear it in their own homes is unacceptable, especially after 11pm, when you should ensure that any music is turned down so it would have little or no bearing on your neighbours' ability to get a good night's sleep. Loud music is the most commonly cited complaint from a party, but even loud conversation and boisterous behaviour needs to be tempered after 11pm, as that can be equally annoying to a neighbour.

You are responsible for your guests and they should be told what's acceptable.


